



History Club

In the lead up to Remembrance Sunday History club learnt about the significance and importance of the poppy. The children also learnt about the Christmas Truce, and the football game that took place between British and German troops on Christmas Day in 1918. Troops used No Man's Land as the pitch and their uniforms as goal posts.

History club then recreated the trenches in the classroom, emerging themselves in the atmosphere with sound clips. From this they then wrote moving, sentimental and emotional letters imaging themselves as soldiers on the front line.

The whole school contributed to the History display by colouring in poppies. Red in remembrance of the human lives lost, purple for the animals lost and white to celebrate peace.

Members of our History club performed a wonderful assembly to the whole school and all 427 children and adults impeccably observed a one minute silence at 11am.
